Eligibility will be determined by United Way before contributions are disbursed.

Contributing to Every Agency in the Directory

To support every agency in the directory, simply leave the designation boxes blank on your pledge form. Your contribution will be distributed according to the following formula established by the Campaign Committee:

- 75% of undesignated funds are contributed to the local United Way to be distributed by informed volunteers according to local needs.
- 25% of undesignated funds are distributed to other agencies in the Local Government and Schools Campaign in the same proportion as all the other designations the agencies receive.

Administrative Fee Assessed

The Local Government and Schools donations are assessed an administrative fee to cover the costs of fundraising and processing. The administrative rate is assessed at the end of each campaign year. The administrative fee for the 2011 campaign year is 15%.
