### What We Do

United Way of Greater Richmond & Petersburg understands the importance of school readiness, as well as the holistic approach required to truly prepare our young children for kindergarten. That's why we invest in programs that focus on family stability, literacy and social emotional development.

- In 2019, United Way of Greater Richmond & Petersburg launched **Kindergarten Countdown Camp**, a program for rising kindergarten students with limited to no preschool experience. Taught by licensed teachers, Kindergarten Countdown Camp prepares students and their parents for a successful start in kindergarten.
- Throughout the year, we assemble more than 1,000 **United Way Literacy Kits** that are distributed to students in our region. Each kit includes school supplies, an age-appropriate book, information for parents and supplies for children.
- United Way builds and installs Steps to Success Early Learning Trails in local parks and other community spaces. These trails help
  parents, caregivers and communities use everyday moments outdoors to boost school readiness of children in their preschool years.
